Mary's experience in executive leadership and community-based program development has progressed from the leadership of two separate shelters for women and children fleeing domestic violence and the oversight of daily operations for community-based services for adults and residential group homes for youth, to person-centered case management services for children and their families and the direction of professional and direct care staff serving 100+ individuals with developmental disabilities and/or mental health needs. COMMUNITY PROFILE: KELL OLSON: DEFENDING LGBTQ+ RIGHTS AS ATTORNEY WITH LAMBDA LEGAL BY JOYCE BOLINGER

Kell Olson cannot forget the powerful image of a seventh grade girl in the last Arizona legislative session. Standing alone, she defended herself against state legislators who were debating the ability of trans kids to participate in sports at their schools.

"I wanted to put my body between her and the legislators who were hurling gross attacks at her," Kell says. This is an example

of why Kell has thrown himself into defending LGBTQ rights as a Staff Attorney in the Western Regional Office of Lambda Legal.

Lambda Legal is a national organization dedicated to representing LGBTQ people and those living with HIV in courts and public opinion. Lambda Legal's lawyers have won precedent-setting civil rights cases on everything from marriage equality to expressions of gender identity to health care discrimination.

Although Kell's cases typically are based in western states, he has represented Florida parents who are challenging censorship laws. He is also on a team that is challenging an Idaho law that dictates that students in all K-12 campuses have to use bathrooms according to sex assigned at birth.

"It is transparently politically motivated to use trans youth as political pawns, judging they are the safest and most vulnerable target," Kell says. He is especially touched by his talks with parents who relate their anguish at the painful struggle to support their children. "The conservative focus on attacking trans youth diverts attention from important issues such as affordable housing," Kell comments.

Kell's road to Lambda Legal began in 2002 at Wingspan, the now closed LGBTQ community center in Tucson. He worked as a youth outreach specialist at Wingspan, eventually becoming the coordinator of the youth program.

He received his law degree from the University of Arizona law school and interned at Lambda Legal as a student. Then, for four years he clerked for two Arizona Court of Appeals judges, followed by seven years as a Deputy Pima County Attorney handling civil cases. He began at Lambda Legal two years ago.

Kell identifies as a trans man. He is married to Jennifer Hoefle Olson and they have twin girls, now in middle school. He enjoys attending astronomy "star parties" and doing karaoke with his daughters. As a family they love hiking and rock climbing.

Kell stresses the real power of talking about our LGBTQ history with young people who haven't seen a backlash like this. "We are in familiar territory even though the issues are different. But we see people connecting to peel back layers of mis-information and fear," he adds.

This gives him the energy and motivation to tackle the hard cases that Lambda Legal takes

In it, "Genly Ai and Estraven - two men in exile from the worlds they know – are pushed into howling arctic-style terrain ...lt is a threemonth journey of the harshest possible kind..
